Even assuming that the factors laid out in *Mathews v. Eldridge*, 424 17 U.S. 319, 334 (1976), apply, Kumar received the basic guarantees of due process—an 18 individualized determination, notice of the reason for the revocation, and an opportunity to 19 respond—which is all that should be required when weighing Kumar's limited liberty interest 20 against the government's interest in effective and timely resolution of immigration proceedings. 21 Accordingly, the Court should deny Kumar's petition and dismiss this matter. 22 /// 23
