

# Keeping families together. Protecting people from violence. Standing up to injustice.

**We believe that all people deserve the opportunity to access justice, safety, and the ability to stay together with the ones they love, no matter where they were born or how much money they have.**

However, many immigrants are unable to access basic rights simply because they cannot afford an attorney. Without representation, they are left to navigate the legal system on their own, often with dire outcomes. For over 30 years, NWIRP has **provided free, high quality legal representation** which keeps families together, protects people from violence in their homes or home countries, and provides individuals with new opportunities in work and education.

We also work at the systemic level to create lasting change to policy. NWIRP takes on targeted, precedent-setting lawsuits that have **challenged and changed unjust immigration policies** affecting immigrants regionally and nationally.

Many immigrants are not aware of what their rights are and what resources are available to them. To address this, NWIRP **leads community education efforts** across Washington State to educate and empower immigrants to learn their rights and the immigration protections that are available to them.

**“I left Honduras because the violence got bad. Once I got to my cousin’s house in Washington, I had to go to immigration court, but I couldn’t afford an attorney. Then I found an attorney from NWIRP. Now I have a green card. I’m in high school and play on our soccer team. I want to become a pilot. But for now, I’m just happy to be living safely in the United States.”**

Every year, we serve more than **10,000** individuals from over **130** countries.

We work statewide with **4** offices in Seattle, Granger, Tacoma, and Wenatchee.

We have over **70** staff members and are continuing to grow.

More than **350** volunteer attorneys donate over **11,000** hours to NWIRP cases annually, making our pro bono program the second largest in the state.

We have an annual budget of **6.5 million** dollars which includes revenue from individual donors, government grants, and private foundations.
