

Free DACA Renewal Clinic - Seattle

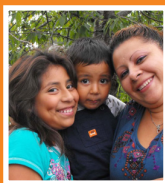
Please call **1-855-313-7326** to schedule an appointment if you have received DACA status and continue to be eligible.

If you previously received DACA and your DACA expired on or after Sept. 5, 2016, you may still file your DACA request as a renewal request. If your DACA expired before Sept. 5, 2016, you must file a new initial DACA request and submit all of your documentation again including proof of continuous presence in the U.S. since June 15, 2007 to today.

We are prioritizing DACA recipients whose work permits have already expired or will expire within the next 6 months.

What to bring

1. Copy of your previous DACA application that was submitted to USCIS including all 3 forms.
2. Copy of your Employment Authorization Document (Front and Back)
3. I-821D Approval Notice if you have it
4. Optional: Forms I-821D, I-765, and I-765 WS filled out to the best of your ability. You can find the forms here: <http://www.uscis.gov/i-821d>
5. Two passport style pictures size 2 inches by 2 inches.
6. The application fee is \$495 dollars. Application fee can be paid via check or money order to the Department of Homeland Security
